Renovation Nearing Completion



A year ago, after much thoughtful discussion, the congregation of Wolfville Baptist Church made the exciting decision to move forward with a major building renovation. The highlight of this project is an elevator—soon to be installed—a long-awaited dream that has been on the congregation's wish list for decades. This important addition will ensure that everyone can move freely between all three floors and participate fully in the life of the church.

To accommodate the elevator, a new entrance has been constructed on the south side of the building. Beside the elevator, four indoor steps with sturdy handrails lead directly to the Vestry. Outside, near the parking area, a spacious canopy provides welcome shelter from the weather for all who enter. The renovation also includes two updated offices, two washrooms (one fully accessible), a laundry closet, an elevator machine room, and a storage space.

Roscoe Construction is completing the project with funding made possible through the generous donations of both current and former congregation members, along with financial support from the Province of Nova Scotia. Special thanks are extended to the Building Inspection Department of the Town of Wolfville and the Nova Scotia Office of the Fire Marshal for ensuring that every aspect of the project meets all safety and building code standards.



Reflecting on the process, WBC Curator and Architect **Don Beaton** shared:

"I'm pleased and honoured to have been involved in this project. It has been a joy to work with the Wolfville Baptist Church Board of Management and to experience their trust, support, and prayer-inspired decision-making throughout."

Often the argument for a blended service has been to find a balance of centuries-old hymns and contemporary Christian music: both sides are Eurocentric and hardly represent today's diversity in churches. So hopefully on any given Sunday at Wolfville Baptist you might hear both the older hymns and Christian songs, but also contemporary hymnody, world music, folk music, jazz, gospel, classical and improvised blends of all the above!



We have four groups that participate in the Music Ministry at Wolfville Baptist (in alphabetic order):

Kidzquire is active with 18 lively and lovely kids grades 1-8. We are thankful to our new co-director this year, Lisandre Chrétien, a music therapy student from Québec who comes with a lot of experience working with kids.


We are performing several times this fall, with an African hymn of Thanksgiving (October 12), a song that combines What a Friend We Have in Jesus with ethnic world music (November 9), and tunes from a musical called Uncertain Poor Shepherds (December 7).



The **Men's Ensemble** (the TGIF Ensemble) is small but mighty (with room for more voices)! We are planning to sing a beautiful barbershop arrangement of *Amazing Grace* (November 16) and a rousing rendition of *Go Tell it on the Mountain* the last Sunday of Advent (December 21).

The **Praise and Worship Team** is a new addition to our musical offerings this year. We are grateful for experienced musicians coming together with several talented teens to lead the congregation, usually twice a month, in singing the contemporary songs of the faith. Faith: This fall, our theme is "Inviting Teens into Disruptive Joy with Jesus."


